

Inter-Lakes High School 2008-209 Highlights

Student Achievement:

The Class of 2009 had a 96% graduation rate, with 78% of the class going on to 2 and 4 year colleges (55% 4 year college and 23% 2 year colleges.) Inter-Lakes High School students were accepted into 72 colleges and universities in 16 different states and 2 foreign countries. 2% of the Class of 2009 enlisted in the armed services and 17% went into the world of work.
